### Programs operating at the Centre:

### Preschool/kindergarten

We have 2 preschool groups. The red group come every Monday and Tuesday (full days) and ½ day Wednesday each fortnight. The blue group comes every Thursday and Friday (full days) and ½ day each Wednesday fortnight.

We have a fully integrated Inclusive Preschool Program, (a program that caters for children with extensive adjustments) currently integrated with our red preschool group.

### **Occasional Care**

We have occasional care sessions available for under 2 year old children and over 2 year old children. These sessions operate Tuesday (am and pm session) and Wednesday (pm session).

### Playgroups





We operate playgroups over the week. Playgroups vary each term, depending on the need. Our constant playgroup is on Friday morning and we have operated at different times the following playgroups:

Toddler playgroup, 3 and 4 year old playgroup, baby playgroup, garden playgroup and messy play.

The curriculum is developed in partnership with children through a play based program. Our staff work as a team to provide high quality teaching and learning programs within the context of the National Quality Framework for Early Childhood Education and Care.

# **Centre Facilities:**

The Centre was established as a Children's Centre in 2007, with changes to services offered in 2012. The Centre had major renovations in 2013/4 to upgrade our reception and group room facilities and a further office area built in 2020. The indoor space is open with a small room for group and individual work. The indoor area has been treated acoustically, allowing for the optimum learning environment. The preschool outdoor learning environment was recently updated and all weather PVC blinds installed on our veranda.

The centre also has a large community space with a full kitchen in which we run community programs such as playgroups, occasional care and parent programs. The community outdoor learning environment is about to be extended and improved.

In 2021 we opened our Community Garden, which is a joint venture with community groups. It provides opportunity for children and families to learn about sustainability and organic practices.

Access for children and staff with disabilities: Disabled access is available to the Centre.





The Centre is located in a multi-cultural diverse area, with many families newly arriving in Australia. Fewer families have arrived over the past 2 years with the impact of COVID-19. The Centre is easily accessible by bus from Trafford Street.

Adjacent our centre we have a newly build council library and there is a theatre, sports complex and playground operated by YMCA within walking distance.

Directly behind the centre is a new housing estate currently being developed.

### **Further Comments**

The centre is part of the Inner West Partnership and works closely with the DfE schools and preschools within the partnership. Agreed Partnership priorities underpin the work of all sites within the partnership and influence the centre's direction.

We also work with government and non-government agencies to deliver a community capacity building program about the importance of developing early literacy skills for children from birth. This is called Paint the Parks and Gardens REaD.
